

FINANCIAL REPORTS



Our investments are managed by five financial institutions: The Dime Bank, The Honesdale National Bank, Wayne Bank, Morgan Stanley, and CornerStone Asset Management. CornerStone Asset Management also helps act as Chief Investment Officer for the Foundation. Their staff works closely with the local representatives at the other four institutions to communicate a comprehensive view of our investment portfolios. Our investment committee, made up of Foundation board members, meets five times a year; once with each investment partner. The financial statements of the Wayne County Community Foundation are audited each year by a certified public accountant.

The Wayne County Community Foundation is a 501(c)3 nonprofit, tax-exempt organization. EIN 23-2656896

HOW TO ESTABLISH A CHARITABLE FUND

Creating a charitable fund with us is as simple as 1-2-3:

- 1. **Select a cause area to support.** Decide what matters most to you in our community and let us collaborate with you to shape a fund that aligns with your charitable aspirations.
- 2. **Create a fund name that reflects your intentions.** Whether you wish to honor a cherished loved one, support a cause you're passionate about, or establish a legacy for your family, you can name the fund to mirror that intention.
- 3. **Contribute with a tax-deductible gift.** This can be a gift of cash today, a planned gift through your estate, a gift of stock or other asset, or invite your network of friends, family, and colleagues to join in supporting the fund's support area.

WHAT KIND OF CHARITABLE FUNDS DO WE HAVE?

<u>Donor-advised Funds</u>: You can stay actively involved in the distribution of dollars from this fund by establishing a Donor-Advised Fund. You recommend grants to the Foundation Board of Directors and the size of the grant to charitable organizations of your choosing.

<u>Endowment Funds</u>: You can establish an endowment fund to benefit one or more organizations you determine, but only spend from the principal of the fund (usually 3-4% yearly). This is a great way to continue annual giving in perpetuity.

<u>Scholarship Funds</u>: The Community Foundation manages a variety of scholarship funds ranging from those that support college studies for outgoing seniors in high school to furthering education in trades and certificate programs or master's degree programs.

<u>Field of Interest Funds</u>: Support nonprofit organizations within a general area of interest such as youth programming, literacy, animal welfare, arts, and culture, or a specific geographic region of Wayne County.

<u>Nonprofit Organization/Agency Funds</u>: These funds are created by a nonprofit organization with the goal of it lasting into the future, while having the flexibility to serve the organization's more pressing needs when they arise. It's the best of both worlds.

<u>Pass Through Funds</u>: The Foundation assists a variety of charitable groups that have short-term or seasonal fundraising needs. We serve as their "fiscal sponsor" and comply with federal and state fundraising regulations. We are proud to serve these well-known groups and projects and wish them success in reaching their goals.

Creative Communities Art Trail

Rising up from the grounds of the Equinunk Historical Society stands a brand new sculpture park. A cascade of steel pillars showcases the work of local artists and under the shade of an old tree sits a hand-crafted picnic table, chess table, and fireplace. Near the museum's entrance is a dedicated space for Lenape artwork featuring two pieces depicting important cultural moments and a large illuminated steel map gives the context for the location, placing it among important natural and historical landmarks.

The park is part of the Creative Communities Art Trail, a county-wide initiative spanning the north-south length of Wayne County with the purpose of connecting some of the smaller towns through place-based, locally-designed public art sites. The Wayne County Community Foundation has convened a group of community nonprofit organizations including the Wayne County Arts Alliance, Equinunk Historical Society, Newfoundland Public Library, and The Cooperage Project in addition to multiple community members to create these art installations. Funding for these projects has been provided by the Wayne County Community Foundation, the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau, and generous donations from individuals and businesses.









In addition to the park in Equinunk, another location is in the works in Newfoundland which is set to open later this fall and features a tile mosaic depicting the town's history set against the four seasons.

WAYNE TOMORROW! INITIATIVE

The Wayne County Community Foundation participates actively in the Wayne Tomorrow! Initiative. Wayne Tomorrow! is a broad, county-sponsored, community-based collaboration focused on the projects, resources, and infrastructure needed to move Wayne County, its people, its culture, and its economy into a vibrant future. It's not an entity, it's a partnership, a way of operating, and an active planning complement to Wayne County's Comprehensive Plan. This type of collaboration takes a commitment to the common goals and a willingness to focus on "we" not "me"!

In 2019, we established a Wayne Tomorrow! Fund at the Foundation to be able to accept charitable donations to support Wayne Tomorrow! activities and to be a fiscal agent for future grant applications. Additionally, Foundation involvement includes task force participation and networking to connect as many dots as possible to help advance goals related to agriculture, housing, transportation, and other vital components of our Wayne County ecosystem.

LACKAWAXEN RIVER TRAILS



The Wayne County Commissioners and the Lackawaxen River Trails group marked the official opening of the county's first public river access on the Lackawaxen River on Friday, October 27, 2023.

Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn, Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) Executive Director Tim Schaeffer and PFBC Board President William Gibney joined commissioners, state and local elected officials, and others who made the project a reality.

DCNR and PFBC have partnered to fund grants submitted by Wayne County Commissioners for three river access sites in all. The one to be opened October 27th is located in White Mills, Texas Township. Two others will be constructed next year, one in Honesdale and one in Indian Orchard.

The Wayne County Community Foundation is thrilled to be the fiscal sponsor for the Lackawaxen River Trails Fund which the Lackawaxen River Trails uses to accept charitable donations for matching grants and other projects along the river. WOMEN IN PHILANTHROPY

In 2024, the Wayne County Community Foundation was thrilled to partner with the Scranton Area Community Foundation to establish a Women in Philanthropy Fund.

Investing in women and girls is one of the best, proven methods of fighting poverty and stopping the cycle of poverty from spreading from one generation to the next. By targeting major issues that impact women and girls, this fund provides support for



innovative projects that will help address the root causes of poverty and inequality. Women in Philanthropy (WIP) will empower and transform the lives of women and girls in Lackawanna and Wayne Counties.

Women in Philanthropy is composed of individuals who want to be actively involved in making decisions that impact the well-being of women and girls in our community. Currently, over 25 donors have supported the Women in Philanthropy Fund at the Wayne County Community Foundation – with many donors choosing to make recurring contributions throughout the year!

This year, the Women in Philanthropy Fund awarded \$11,000 to support the following programs that directly impact women and girls in Wayne County:



\$6,000 to The Cooperage Project to support two of its out of school programs, Coop Camps and Pop-Up Club.

\$3000 to Wayne Pike Workforce Alliance to support EmpowerHER, a pilot program designed to foster participation and advancement of women in STEAM fields.

\$1,500 to Lacawac Sanctuary Field Station to support Pathways in Ecological Research (PiER) mentorship program.

\$500 to Penn State to support mental health programming for women and girls.



Building Home Libraries

A good book can open our eyes and show us so much more of the world than what we can see in our day-to-day lives. Stories take us to new places, introduce us to new people, and give us just a little glimpse into someone else's life. Reading is one of the most important skills we can have, and a love of reading is a special gift.

We're determined to give every K-8 student in the Wayne Highlands, Western Wayne, Forest City, and Wallenpaupack school districts a book to take home and keep through our Building Home Libraries project. This year we distributed over 3,000 books in schools with an additional 5,000 going out into the community!





Educational Improvement Tax Credit Program

The Wayne County Community Foundation acts as a conduit to support highly academic innovative and challenging STEM programs and dual enrollment at Wayne Highlands, Wallenpaupack, Western Wayne, and Forest City Regional School District. A total of \$135,500 was donated for the 2023/2024 school year by The Dime Bank, PPL Electric Utilities, The Honesdale National Bank, NBT Bank, FNCB Bank, Waste Management, Weis Markets, Maple City Anesthesia, Wayne Bank, and the First National Bank of Pennsylvania to support the program.

Youth Advisory Committee

The mission of the Youth Advisory Committee of the Wayne County Community Foundation is to familiarize Wayne County youth with the potential of philanthropic activities by providing the opportunity – through cooperative leadership – to give financial support to projects designed to improve the youth community.

The intent of the Youth Mini-Grants Program is to introduce the concept of a Community Foundation and its work while supplying educational and funding opportunities to students. Grants of up to \$1,000 are available for projects or programs that will benefit elementary and secondary age students in Wayne County schools and/or community groups. 

In his will, Benjamin Franklin wrote, "I wish to be useful even after my death." When he died in 1790, he left £2,000 (the equivalent of about \$478,457.59 in 2023) in a trust fund to be specifically used and saved for 200 years. In keeping with Franklin's philosophy, the Pennsylvania General Assembly directed the perpetual "Ben Franklin Trust" be established and that the interest be used to benefit the citizens of the Commonwealth. On December 17th, 1990, Governor Robert P. Casey signed Act 1990-173 into law, approving the then sum of \$834,000 to be distributed to Community Foundations in Pennsylvania, including the Wayne County Community Foundation which received nearly \$20,000 in 1995.

Each year, a member (or members) from our community is selected for their positive impact on the betterment of Wayne County. 2023's Ben Franklin Service Award Dinner was held on November 3 in honor of Mary Ellen Bentler.

Mary Ellen Bentler is a lifelong resident of Moscow, PA, currently residing in Wayne County. She is a graduate of North Pocono High School and has taken several courses from the Pennsylvania Bankers Association.

Mary Ellen was employed at NBT Bank beginning in 1994 and retired after 27 years in March 2021. Her responsibility as Vice President and Retail Market Manager was to lead and guide branch managers in the market area on sales, business developments, and the successful operation of the branches.

Rotary International is just one of the many community involvements that Mary Ellen supports. Mary Ellen joined the board of Lacawac Sanctuary in 2015 and is still an active member serving as the Treasurer and chair of the Finance Committee. She is also an active member of the Sterling Business & Technology Park Owners Association. Mary Ellen formerly served on the board of the Chamber of the Northern Poconos, the Wayne County Community Foundation, the Salem Public Library, and the Wayne Economic Development Corporation where she served a term as President.

Mary Ellen is the mother of two children and the proud grandmother of four grandchildren. When she is not busy serving the community, she enjoys spending time with her family on her boat at Lake Wallenpaupack.
